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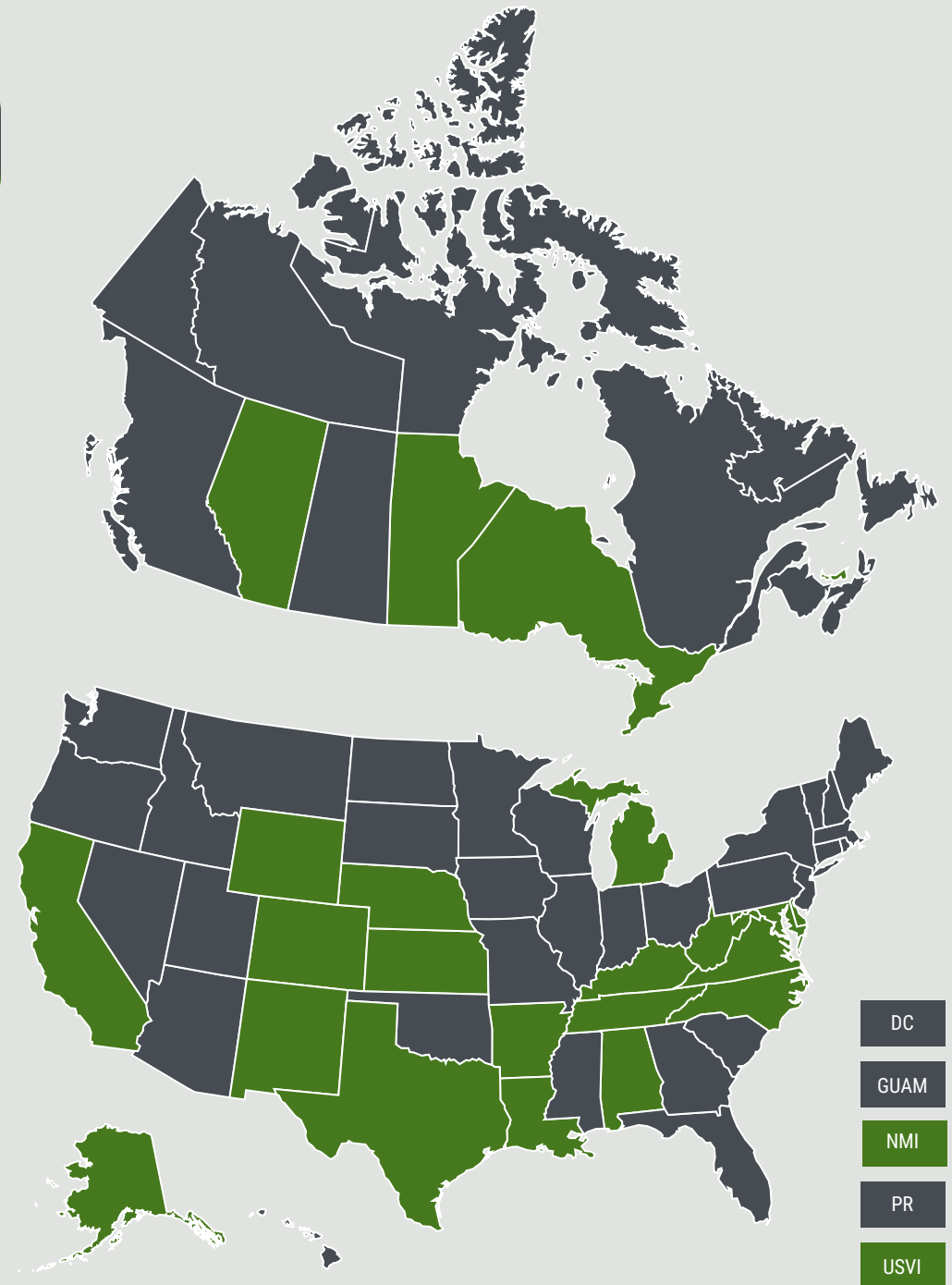
ASPPB® defines a **Psychological Associate** as an individual who is licensed for the independent or supervised practice of psychology, holding a master's degree in psychology.

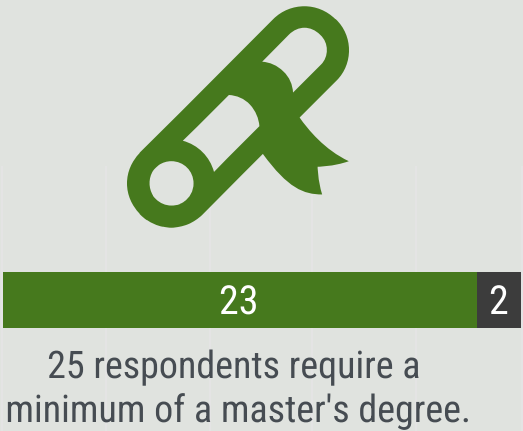

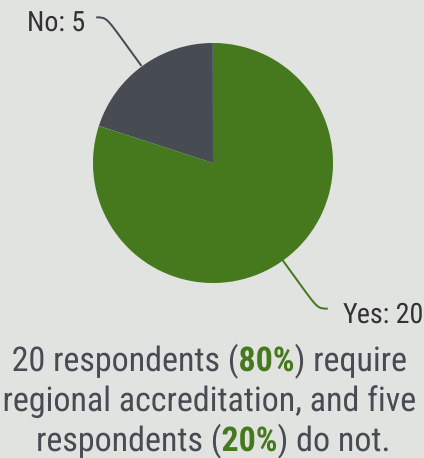

Most respondents indicated that a master's degree is the minimum educational requirement for licensure as a **psychological associate**, with **92%** of jurisdictions requiring at least a master's degree. Most respondents (**82%**) also require regional accreditation, while 18% do not. Additionally, **36%** of responding jurisdictions include a residency requirement as part of their standards.

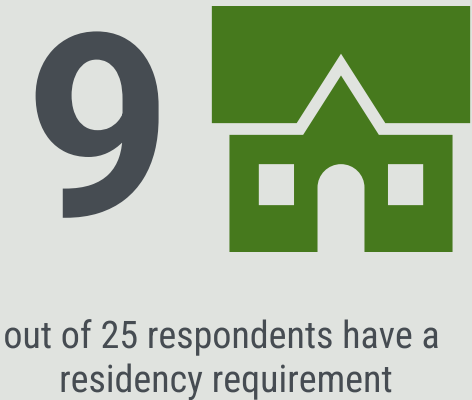
Minimum Degree Required



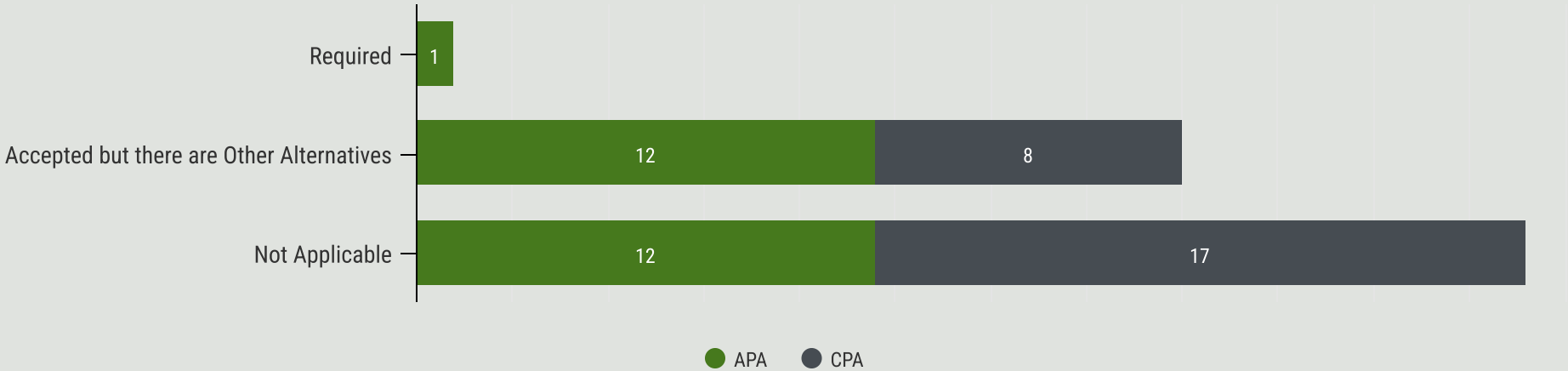
Regional Accreditation

APA/CPA Accreditation

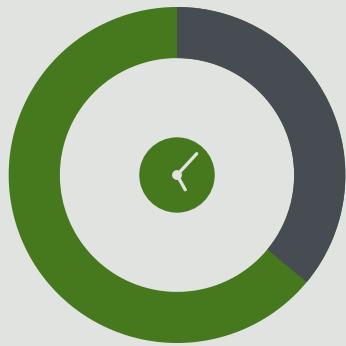


Supervised Experience

Psychological Associate

Among respondents with a **psychological associate** license type, **36%** accept practicum hours toward licensure, while four jurisdictions indicated that practicum hours are not applicable. Internship experience is more commonly required, with **36%** of respondents requiring internship hours, **72%** accepting them, and **16%** identifying other alternatives. Postdoctoral experience is the least common at this level, with only **20%** of respondents requiring it for licensure.

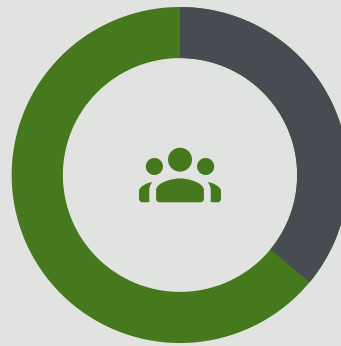

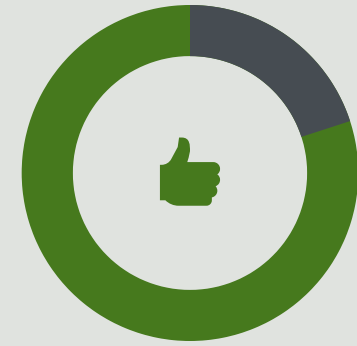
Internship

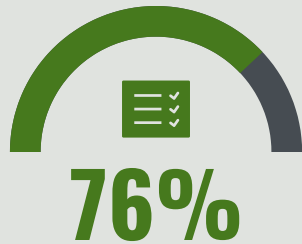

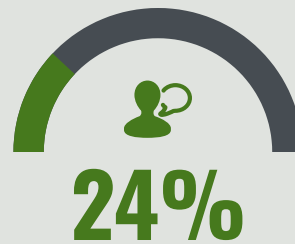
Among respondents with a **psychological associate** license type, **76%** require the EPPP (Part 1-Knowledge). Half of the respondents (**52%**) require a jurisprudence examination assessing laws and regulations related to practice, while **24%** include an oral examination as part of their licensing process.

EPPP (Part 1-Knowledge)



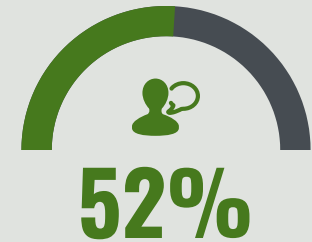

Oral Examination



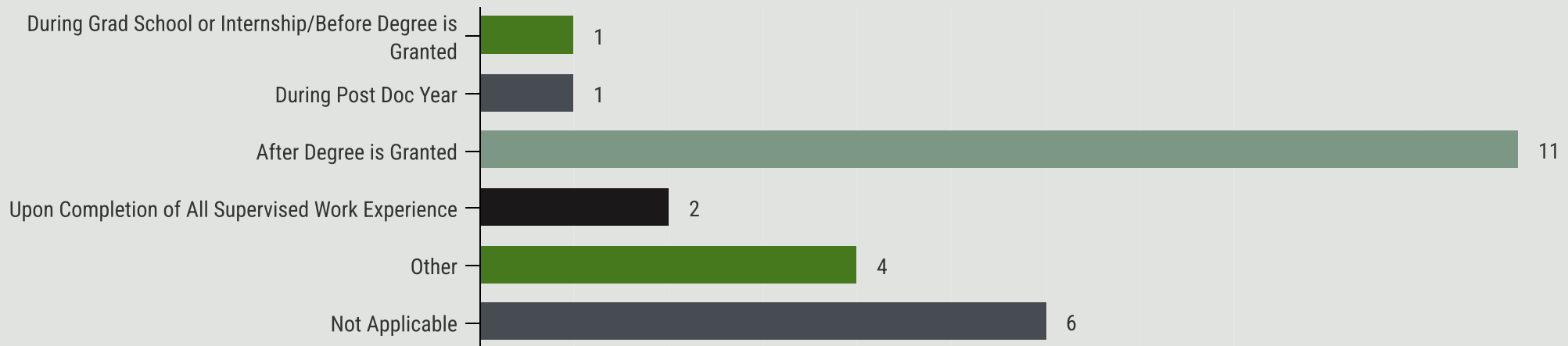

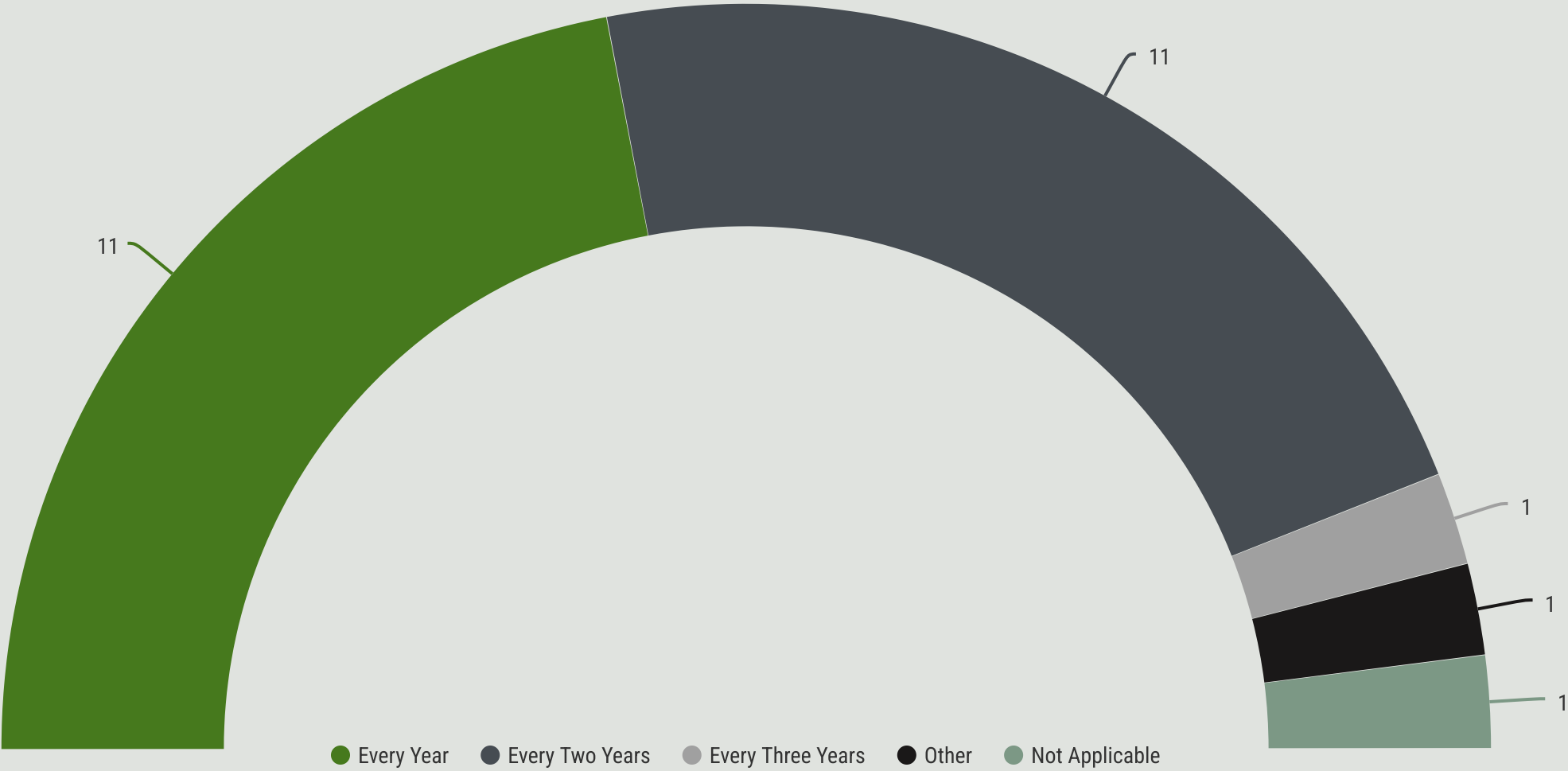

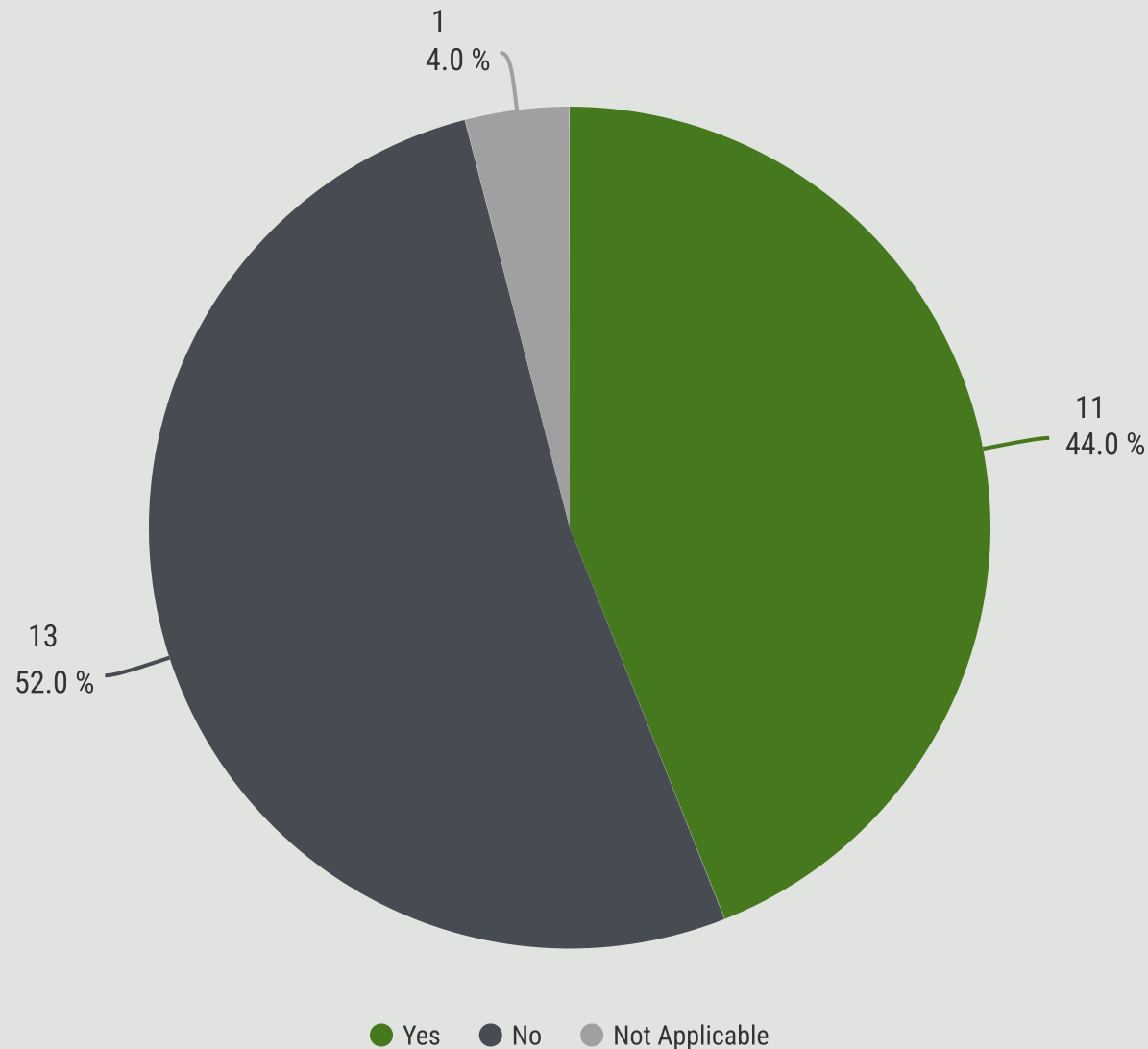
License renewal requirements for **Psychological Associate** licenses are primarily annual or biennial. Among respondents, **44%** renew licenses every year and **44%** every two years. Just **4%** require renewal every three years, while **4%** follow another renewal schedule and **4%** indicated the question was not applicable.

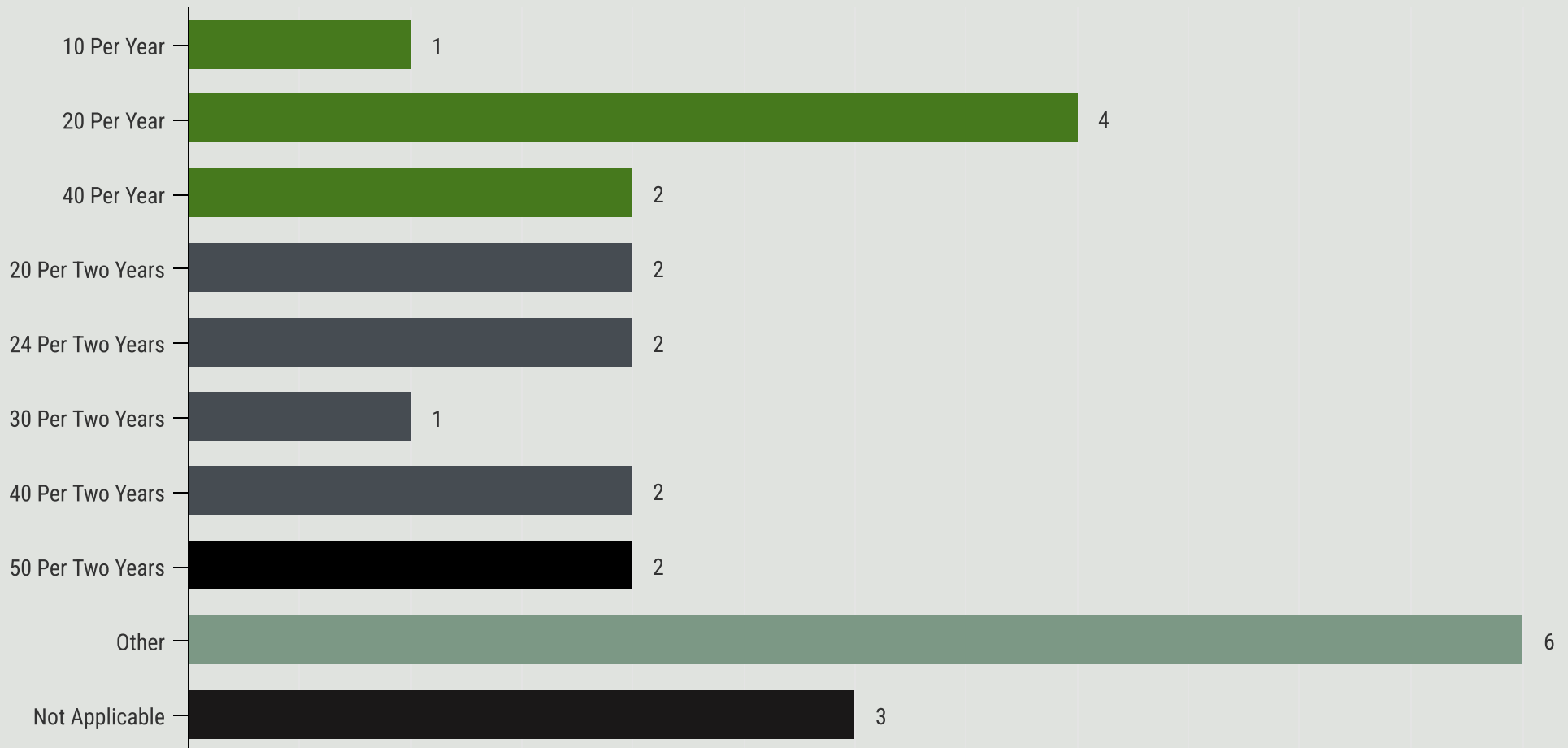
Approximately **52%** of respondents provide for an inactive license status. A **psychological associate** who holds a license may not practice psychology but may continue to use the title "**psychological associate**". A **psychological associate** who holds an inactive license continues to be subject to the statutes and rules/regulations of the psychology licensing board.



Continuing Professional Development & Continuing Education

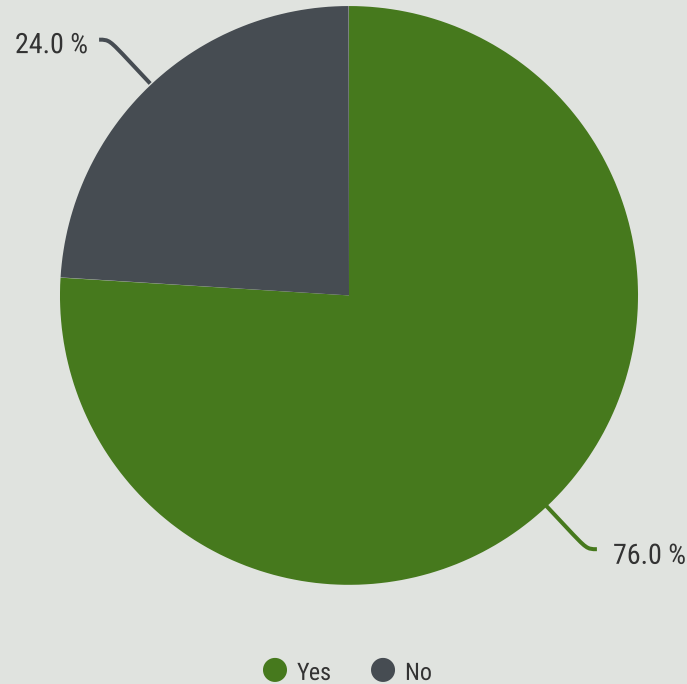
Continuing professional development (CPD) and **continuing education (CE)** requirements for Psychological Associate licensees vary considerably across jurisdictions. Among the 25 respondents, required CE ranges from **10** to **50** hours per renewal period, with **20** hours per year being the most common requirement. Other jurisdictions require **40** hours annually or between **20** and **50** hours every two years, reflecting differences in renewal cycles. Additionally, several jurisdictions reported alternative CE requirements that fall outside these standard categories, highlighting the diversity of continuing education standards for Psychological Associate licensure.



Number of Hours of CPD/CE Required in Each Renewal Period

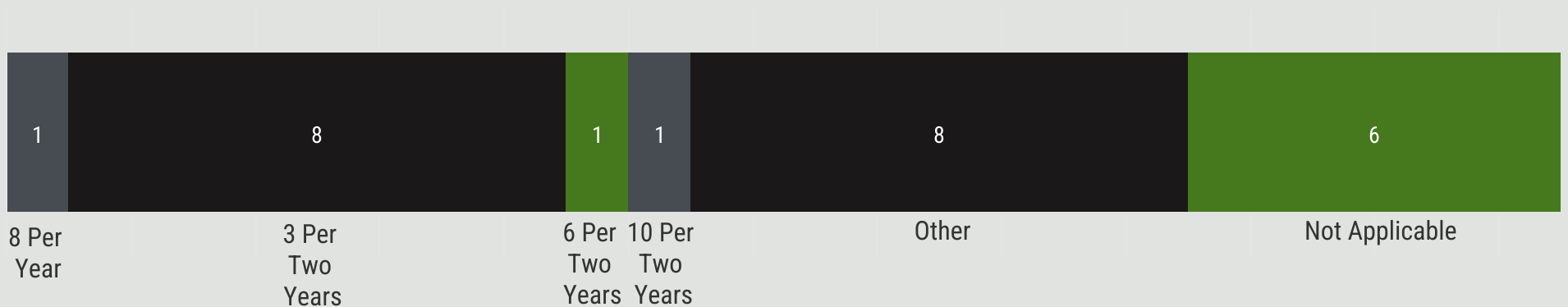
