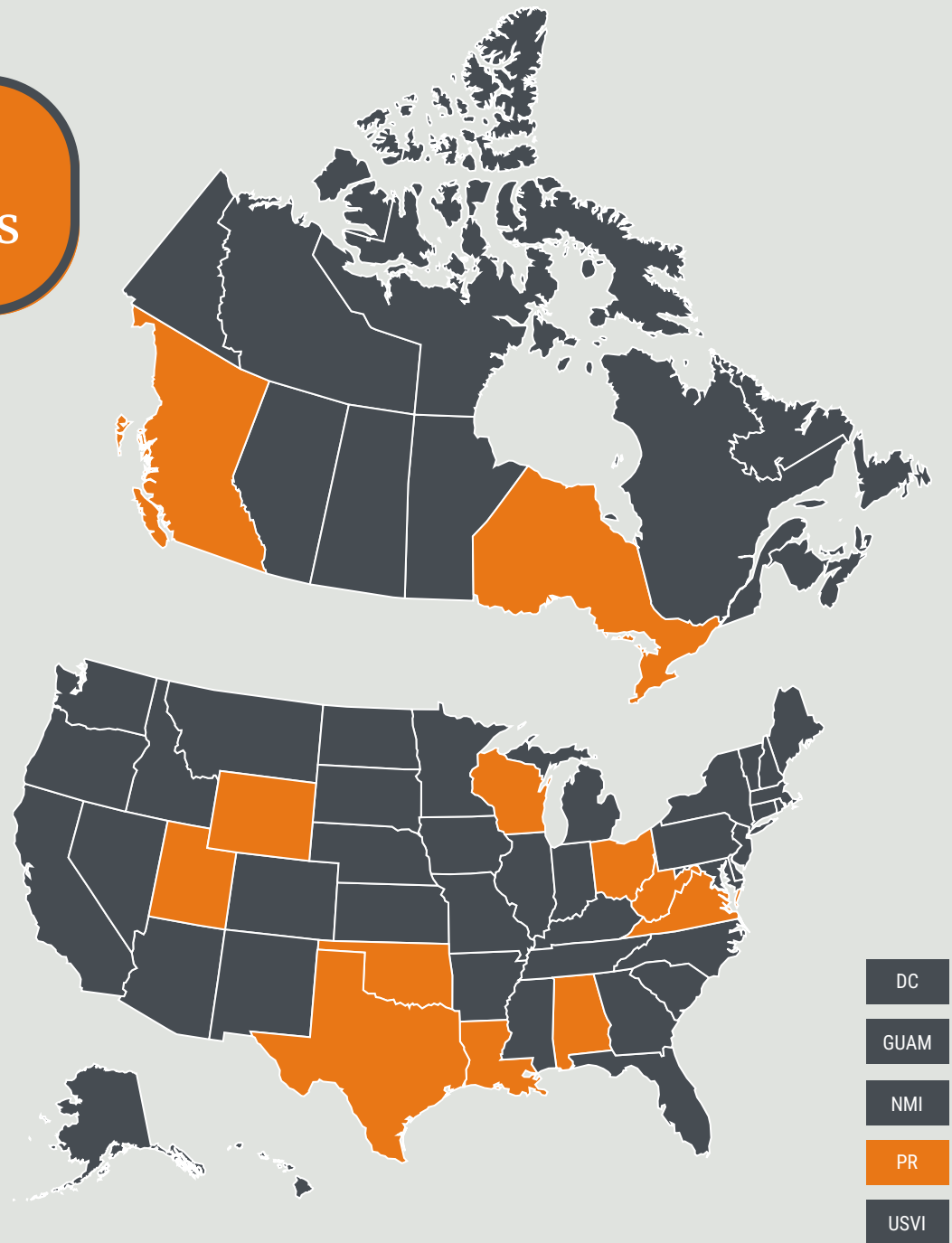

Education

School Psychologist

Among jurisdictions with the **school psychologist** license type, **54%** require at least a master's degree, while **31%** require a doctoral degree. Approximately **92%** of the thirteen respondents require regional accreditation, and **31%** include a residency requirement.

7 respondents require a minimum of a master's degree, and 4 require a doctoral degree. 1 respondent selected 'Other'.

Supervised Experience

School Psychologist

Among respondents with a **school psychologist** license type, **46%** accept practicum hours toward licensure, while one jurisdiction indicated that practicum hours are not applicable. Internship experience is more commonly required, with **92%** of respondents requiring internship hours and **0%** accepting them. Postdoctoral experience is the least common at this level, with only **15%** of respondents requiring it for licensure.

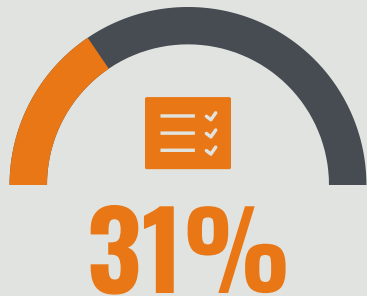

Examinations

School Psychologist

Among respondents with a **school psychologist** license type, **31%** require the EPPP (Part 1- Knowledge), and **0%** require the EPPP (Part 2- Skills). Approximately **69%** of the respondents require a jurisprudence examination assessing laws and regulations related to practice, while only **8%** include an oral examination as part of their licensing process.

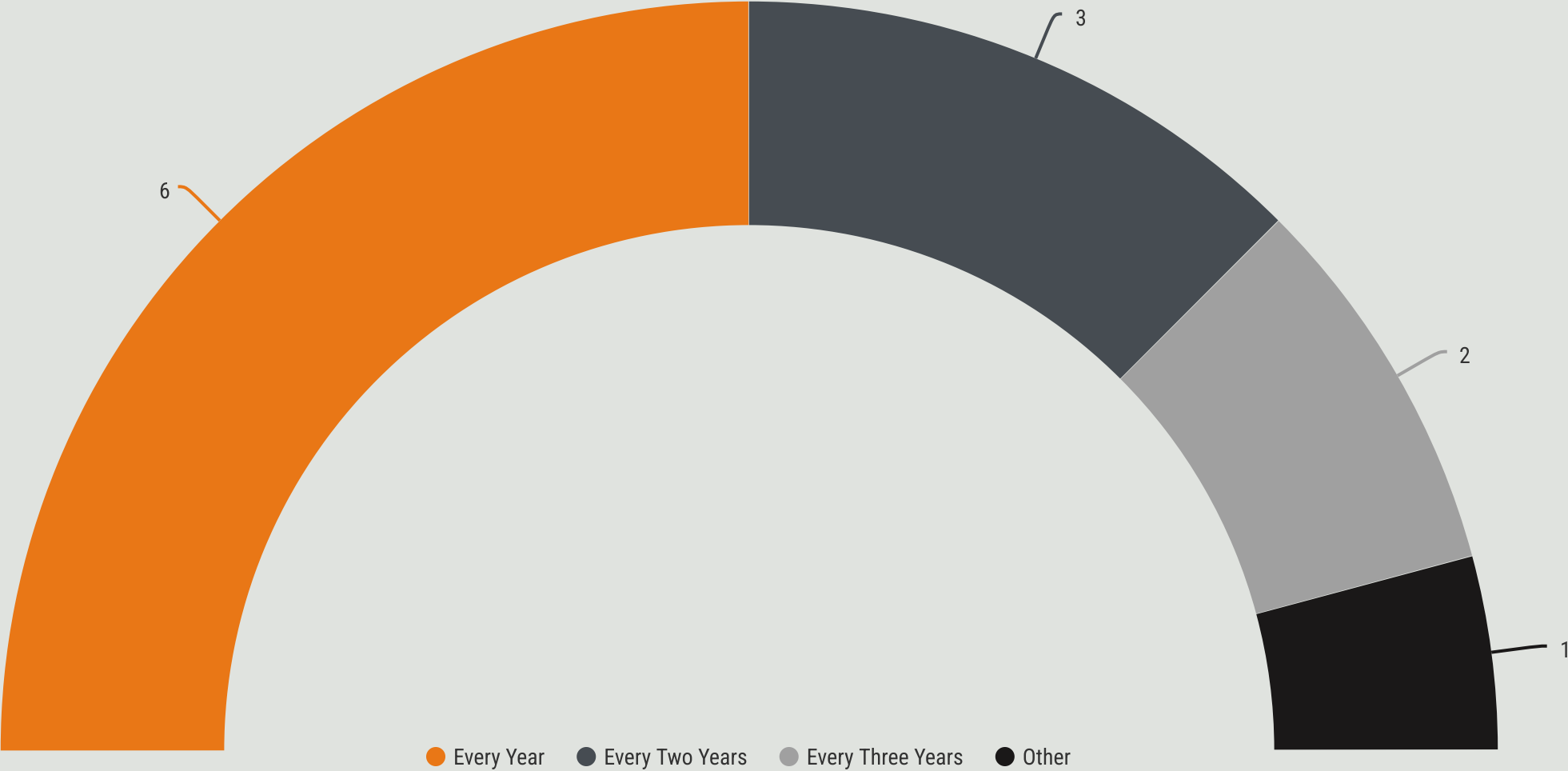

License Renewals

School Pyschologist

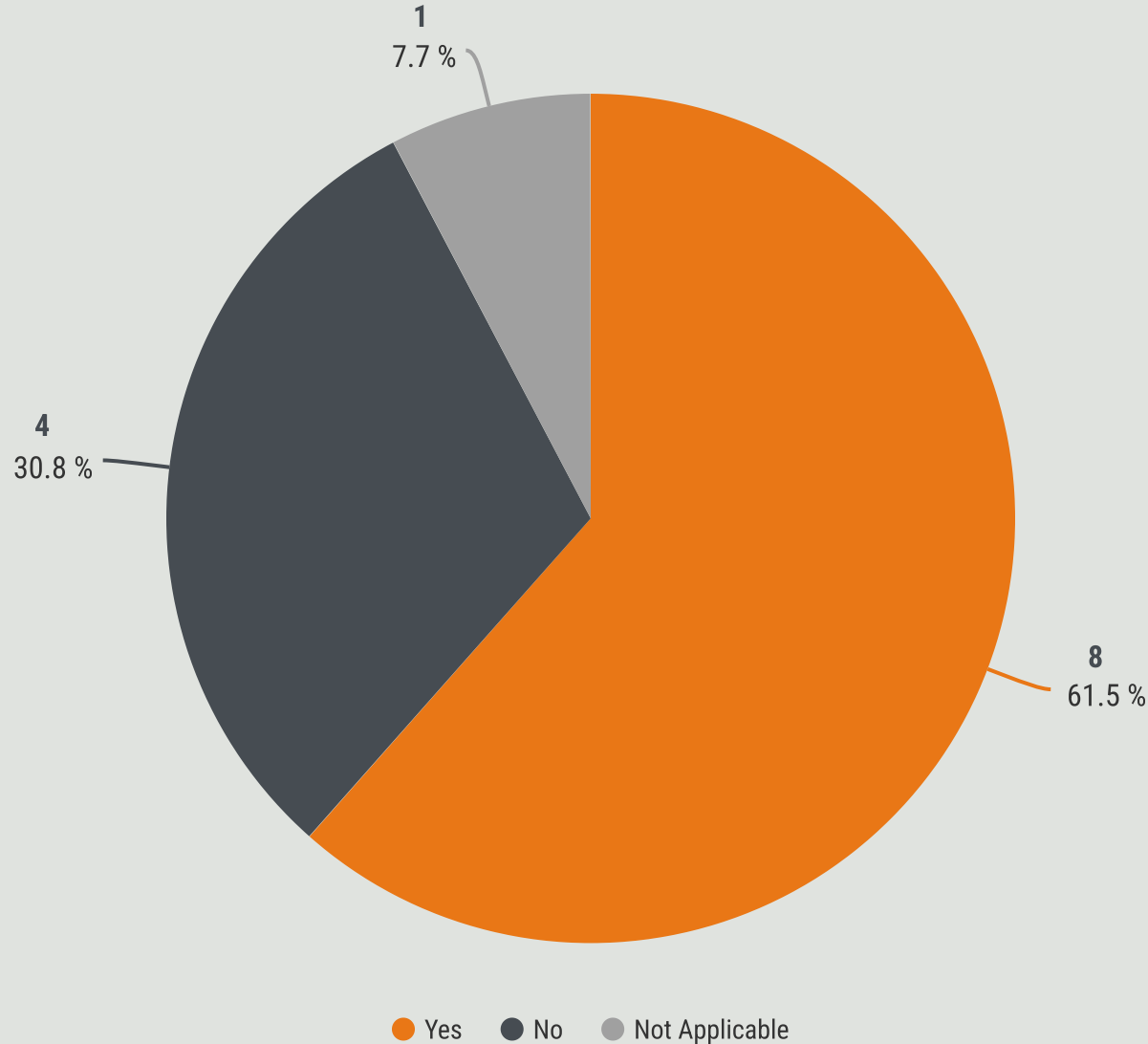
Among respondents with a **school psychologist** license type, **46%** renew their licenses annually, while **23%** renew every two years. Only **15%** renew every three years, and another **8%** follow an alternative renewal schedule.



Inactive Licenses

School Psychologist

Approximately **62%** of respondents provide for an inactive license status. A **school psychologist** who holds a license may not practice psychology but may continue to use the title "**school psychologist**". A **school psychologist** who holds an inactive license continues to be subject to the statutes and rules/regulations of the psychology licensing board.



Continuing Professional Development & Continuing Education

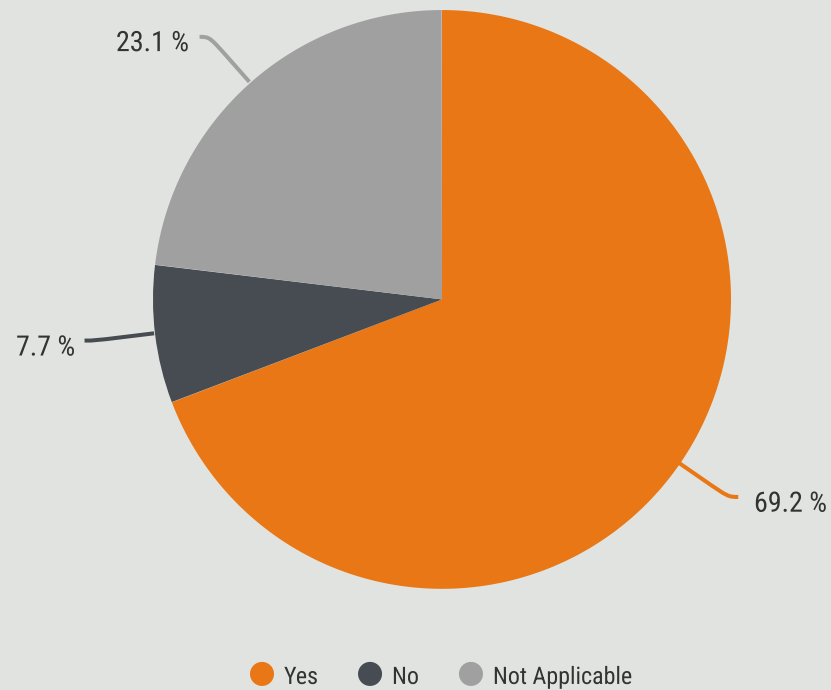
Continuing education (CE) requirements for **school psychologists** vary by jurisdiction, typically ranging from 20 to 40 hours per renewal period. Most jurisdictions set requirements at 35 or 40 hours, with some mandating annual renewals and others biennial. One respondent reported an alternative CE structure, highlighting variation in how ongoing professional development is maintained across regulatory bodies.



Number of Hours of CPD/CE Required in Each Renewal Period

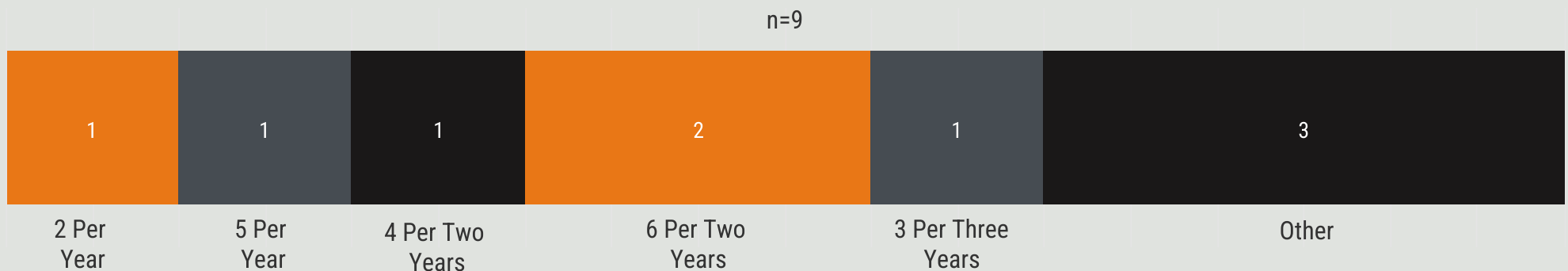
Ethics Requirements
